Minnesota Academy of Reading

The pandemic has created a sudden unanticipated change to instructional strategies within educational institutions globally. During Spring 2021, the executive board of the Minnesota Academy of Reading (MAR) sent their members and members of the Minnesota Reading Association (MRA) a survey using Qualtrics®, focusing on the impact COVID-19 had on their teaching in their context, on their students, teaching practices, tools, and future instructional strategies. 138 respondents (largely P-12 literacy educators) participated by answering multiple choice and open-ended questions, identifying the resources and tools they utilized and expressing the ways their literacy instruction shifted, and what ways, if any, they plan to continue to integrate new tools or strategies they learned during the pandemic. Survey responses were influenced by the sudden fluctuation between online/distance learning, hybrid, and in-person instruction. Student access to technology and tools was limited. Teaching practices were supported, in part, by professional development, though some teachers expressed

needing more support. Respondents listed a myriad of technology tools, how they were used and speculated about how they will be used in the future.

Survey results are well aligned with the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) Standards for Educators including specified roles and actions for effective teaching and learning using technology. The roles of Learner, Leader, Citizen, Collaborator, Designer, Facilitator, and Analyst connect with the change in roles educators needed to make with the pandemic. Secondly, the International Literacy Association's (ILA) Standards for Literacy Professionals (2017) address Foundational Knowledge, Curriculum and Instruction, Assessment and Evaluation, Diversity and Equity, Learners and the Environment, and Professional Learning and Leadership which were areas identified within survey responses. MAR will be sharing more details about their findings including more details about the alignment with ISTE and ILA standards-alignments this spring.


On behalf of MRA and MAR, we wish to offer our sincere thanks to each literacy professional – each participant who took the time to respond to the survey – to click the buttons and to tell parts of their story. We believe the survey was one way of connecting with each other through this strange and challenging pandemic season of isolation. We need to support and learn from one another across the miles, if even only through the ether, to strengthen our practices and keep our stalwart mindset, to stay the course and strengthen literacy learning in Minnesota and beyond!


